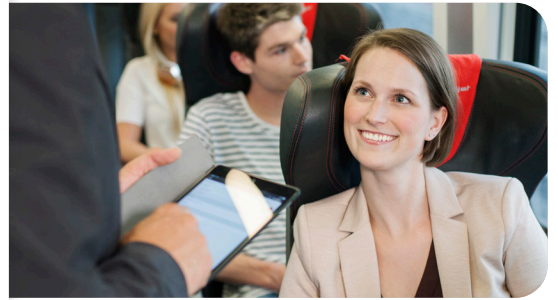

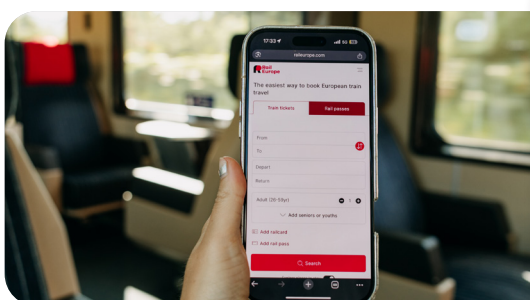

# Types of trains

Europe boasts a wide variety of train options that cover short to long distances, day and night.

## Day trains

Day trains offer a range of schedules, destinations and service options. Many day trains require advance reservations.

## Night trains

Night trains cover long distances as passengers sleep, optimizing itineraries and saving money on a night of hotels. Arrive rested, fresh-faced and ready for a day of sightseeing. Accommodations vary by route, but most include the following options:

- Deluxe sleepers with one and two-berth (or bunk) cabins, shower and toilet in the cabin.
- Sleepers with one, two and three-berth cabins.
- Four or six-berth couchettes.
- Reclining seats.
- Bar and buffet car for light meals and drinks.

A cabin or seat reservation must be made before boarding a night train.

## High-speed trains

Ideal for long-distance travel, high-speed trains connect the most-visited cities in Europe. They run at an impressive speed of up to 300km/h and arrive directly to a city centre, ensuring less time spent travelling and more time adventuring.

Depending on the operator and the route, tickets can be booked from two to six months in advance or even the day of travel, depending on availability. With spacious seats, onboard catering, free wifi and other useful amenities depending on the route and operator, it's no surprise that millions of travellers opt for high-speed travel each year.

## Intercity trains

With an average speed of 170km/h, intercity trains run long-distance service between cities, with multiple stops along the way. They don't run on high-speed tracks but are ideal for enjoying the countryside views.

## Regional and local trains

Regional and local trains travel shorter distances and make frequent stops, connecting smaller cities and towns.

## Scenic trains

Scenic trains are the most popular way to not only take in, but also be completely immersed in Europe's most majestic natural wonders. The journey is the adventure aboard a scenic train.

Top scenic routes: Switzerland's Bernina Express, Glacier Express and GoldenPass Line.





# Types of tickets

## Point-to-point tickets

Point-to-point tickets cover regular, one-way travel between two stations on a specific route. Point-to-point tickets can either be "open tickets" or "global fare premier train tickets."

Open tickets are the most flexible option. When purchasing a ticket, travellers must select a time of departure, but it is not mandatory to travel at that exact time. Open tickets allow for travel on a given route at a fixed price within a certain period of time.

On the other hand, global fare premier train tickets must be used on the specific train indicated on the ticket, which includes a seat reservation. These tickets are valid for most high-speed and night trains.

## Rail Passes

A rail Pass gives unlimited travel on the rail networks of the countries or regions covered by the Pass at one fixed price. Passes offer the best value if an itinerary includes three or more journeys. They are flexible, allowing passengers to choose when to travel (within a set period of time). Children travel for free on many Passes. Other discounts are offered for children, youth and senior travellers depending on the Pass. Passes also provide a discount on trains requiring reservations.

## Eurail and Interrail Passes

These Passes are the most affordable option for those who plan to travel extensively within one country or throughout Europe.

The Eurail and Interrail Passes are train Passes that allow a passenger to travel as much as they wish on participating train operators for a certain number of travel days. A travel day is a day that you can use your Pass to travel. Passengers choose the number of travel days when selecting the type of Pass they wish to purchase. Passes must be activated up to 11 months after purchase. Passes also offer discounts on public transportation and attractions when travelling. Travelling with a Pass is simple. Use the dedicated mobile app to activate a Pass, manage reservation details and track travel days. Showing the mobile ticket to the train inspector takes just a few taps.

The Interrail Pass is available only to European citizens and permanent residents, while the Eurail Pass is available to all other non-Europeans. See page 29 for more information.

# Booking travel

## Reservations

- **A reservation guarantees accommodation (seat/berth) onboard a train and is mandatory on most high-speed, scenic and night trains.**
- **Certain trains in Europe do require a reservation while others do not.**
- **Reservations are included in a global fare premier train ticket.**
- **Reservations must be booked separately when travelling with an "open ticket" or a Pass (for Passholders, the reservation is known as a Passholder fare on some trains).**

## Booking a Passholder fare

Certain types of trains (high-speed trains, international cross border trains, some panoramic trains, night trains and to board ferries), require a reservation for Passholders. These reservations can be made directly on the Eurail app and include a discounted Rail Pass rate.

To reserve seats for these trains, create a trip on the Eurail app, then add each traveller to the trip. Enter the departure and arrival cities, the departure date and time, and start the search. Select the train, the fare and add the journey to the cart. Repeat the process for all the reservations needed for the trip and then checkout.

## Classes of service

Different operators provide different classes of service, but most non-budget trains generally offer First/Business/Premier and Second/Standard Class. The seats, layouts and perks of the class of service depend on the country and provider.

**Depending on the operator, First Class service could include:**

- Access to premier lounges in major train stations.
- Early boarding.
- Larger seats and more foot space.
- Power sockets, Wi-Fi and free entertainment.
- Welcome drinks and snacks.
- At-seat meals (with accommodations for different dietary needs).

The difference in price between classes of service can be nominal, especially when compared with air travel, so consider upgrading to travel in style and comfort.

## Group bookings

Group train travel discounts are often available for groups under 10 passengers, with some exceptions, including UK rail operators.

## Tips for finding cheaper train tickets

Travelling by train is affordable, but there are ways to find even cheaper tickets. Here are some tips:

- Book in advance.
- Travel at off-peak times (which include midday/weekday fares).
- Be flexible with departure and arrival times.
- Book as a group.
- See if the operator provides discounts for youth and senior passengers.
- Take a night train to avoid having to pay for a night of accommodations.
- Take advantage of the discounts on public transportation and attractions that certain Passes and tickets offer.
- Compare all operators and their prices at one time and build out multi-leg journeys with different operators directly on the Rail Europe website.

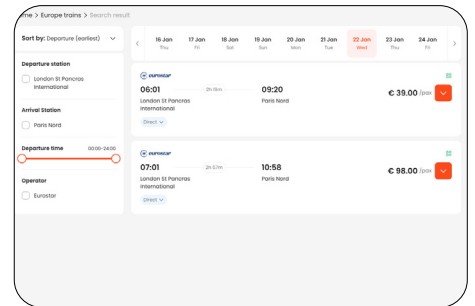

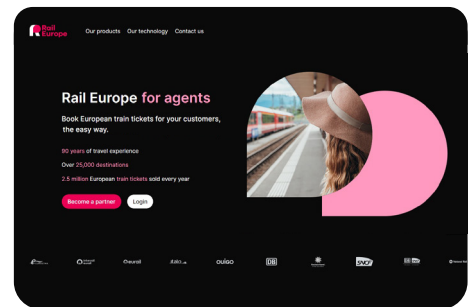

# Maps and schedules of top routes

High-speed trains are by far the easiest, most comfortable way to discover Europe's main cities. Large seats, on-board catering and other amenities, depending on the route, make it a truly enjoyable experience.

Save considerable time by taking the train and getting off in city centres. Avoid the hassle of spending hours waiting at the airport or the fatigue of driving for hours.

Train tickets can be booked from two to six months in advance. E-tickets are available in two formats, Print at Home and Print at Station. Rail passholders can get discounted rates when reserving their seats for high-speed trains. Note that a reservation aboard high-speed, scenic and night trains is required for rail passholders.

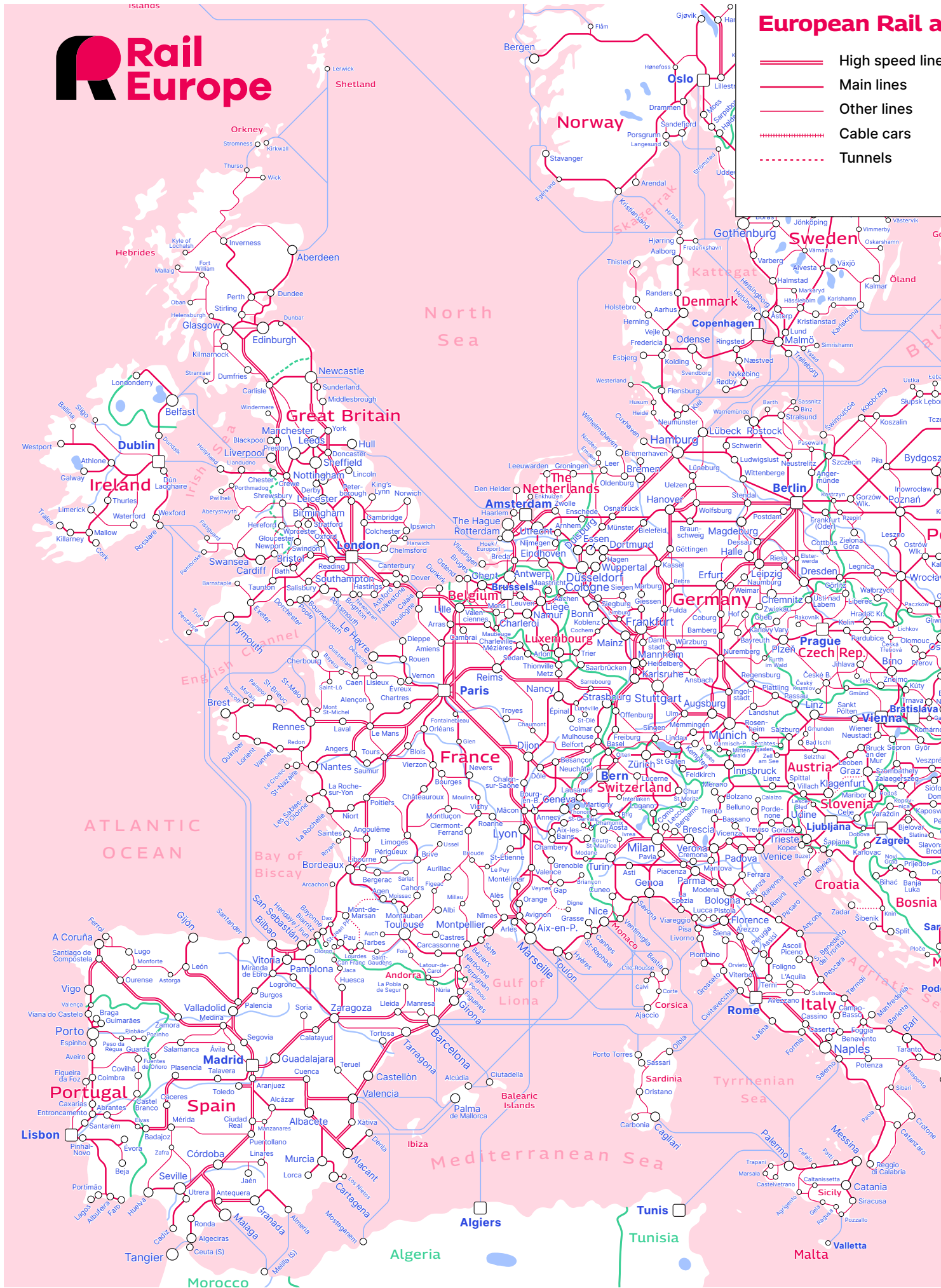
## Our tips:

# European train operators and routes by country

## France

From the Alps to the Ardèche, from Paris to Provence, France is one of Europe's most visited countries. Taking it all in by train is by far the best way to appreciate the Hexagone, as the French like to call their homeland, with a superb network of high-speed trains that runs from Paris to the north, south, east and west. Whichever way the compass points, expect breathtaking architecture, world-famous galleries and landscapes that are undeniably French.

Travellers have many trains to choose from on the French national rail network:

### TGV INOUI BY SNCF

TGV INOUI offers high-speed train services connecting all of France's major cities. TGV trains run smoothly and silently at speeds of over 300km/h in complete safety. Get ready for the launch of the fifth generation of TGV trains, slated for 2026!

First and Second-Class coaches both offer outstanding comfort for work, rest and relaxation. Some TGVs have special areas laid out for customers travelling for business, and others for families or small groups.

## **FRECCIAROSSA BY TRENITALIA**

Frecciarossa offers high-speed trains featuring four levels of service (Executive, Business, Premium and Standard). They travel at 300k/h on the Paris-Lyon and Paris-Marseille routes and at a maximum speed of 200km/h on conventional tracks (between Lyon and Milan). The journey from Paris to Milan takes about six hours.

## **EURAIL AND INTERRAIL FRANCE PASSES**

The Eurail and Interrail France Passes are the perfect way to discover France's diverse cities, coastline and countryside by train. Enjoy the cosmopolitan atmosphere of Paris, the city of love; relax in Nice on the French Riviera; or enjoy local delicacies in Lyon, the capital of French gastronomy.

## **AVE FRANCE-SPAIN BY RENFE**

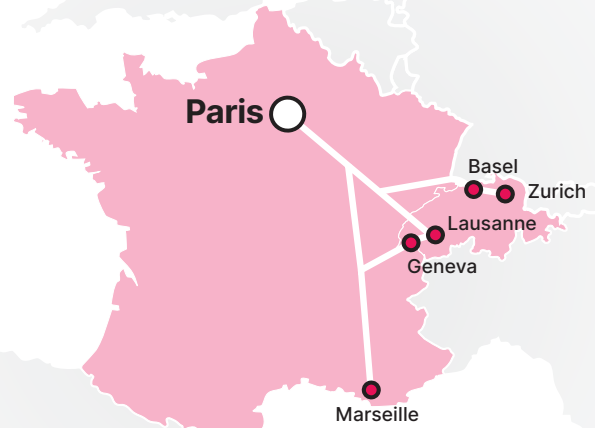

# FAQs

## GENERAL TRAVEL QUESTIONS

### How much luggage can I travel with?

While storage compartments are available on all trains, luggage allowance depends on the train operator and class of service. Most are located at the end of each carriage and/or above the seats. Label luggage to avoid mix-ups. For groups of 10 or more, luggage handling can be reserved in advance on select trains. Note that some major train stations do have luggage storage lockers or storage room services to leave luggage.

### What kind of facilities does a European train station offer?

Most stations offer services such as currency exchanges, shops, information desks, restrooms, restaurants, ATMs, storage, post offices, lounges, bike storage and more. They are often centrally located in a city or town, allowing for easy airport transfers or travel connections.

Train stations are often must-see tourist destinations in their own right, each with its own distinct architecture and history. Take London's St Pancras station, for example. Tourists and locals alike flock to Europe's longest champagne bar nestled right inside the station. Looking to hit the shops? Head to Milan Central's high-end shopping heaven while waiting for a train connection. Travelling through Madrid's Puerta de Atocha station, with its permanent sculpture display, allows passengers to pass the time taking in art instead of just scrolling on social media.

### How early should I arrive for my train?

In general, it is best to arrive at least 30 mins before train departure (45-60 minutes for Eurostar to allow time for customs), but this time frame varies depending on the fare purchased and the station you are travelling from.

### What do I need to know about boarding my train?

#### At the station

Locate the large DEPARTURE and ARRIVAL boards in the centre of most stations. Match what's on the ticket with the departure board. Look for the train number, departure time and platform number, then head to the platform.

#### On the platform

Look for the carriage (or coach) number and wait on the platform nearest to where the coach will arrive. The ticket or reservation will also indicate the class of travel. Many train stations have diagrams located above the platforms that show the location of each coach on the train.

### Seat reservation

If a reservation includes a seat, the seat information will be located on the ticket. Once aboard, proceed to the designated seat.

### What sanitary measures can I expect onboard?

Trains in Europe are cleaned regularly with special attention given to the seating area. Cleaning and disinfection procedures are reinforced in stations, where teams pay particular attention to contact surfaces (handrails, self-service kiosks, elevator buttons, etc.) by cleaning them with disinfectants. Toilet areas and waste collection are also subject to sanitary measures.

## QUESTIONS ABOUT PASSES

### Are there discounts for children, young travellers, seniors or groups?

Children aged 4-11 usually pay half the adult fare. If they are under four, they travel for free unless a reservation for a separate seat/berth is required. In Switzerland, children under 16 travel for free if they are accompanied by at least one parent in possession of a Swiss Travel Pass. Eurail Global and Eurail One Country Passes allow two children under 11 to travel for free with a paying adult. Reservations for separate seats/berths come at an extra cost.

To qualify for a youth discount of up to 25%, travellers must be aged 11-25. In most cases, Youth Passes are available in First and Second Class.

Travellers aged 60 years and over may benefit from special senior discounts on certain Passes.

**IMPORTANT:** Age limits vary based on the product and/or country of travel, so check before booking.

### How does the Eurail or Interrail mobile Pass work?

Travelling with a mobile Pass is simple. Just choose a mobile Pass at checkout, and you'll receive your Pass number in the order confirmation email. Then, upload your Pass into the Rail Planner app. All you need is your phone, the Rail Planner app, and an internet connection to access your mobile Pass.

### How do I activate my mobile Pass?

To add and activate your Pass on the Rail Planner app, simply follow the instructions you receive in your order confirmation. You can do both steps at once, or you can add your Pass to the Rail Planner app and activate it later – it's up to you. You can activate your Pass up to 11 months after purchase.

### How do I book travel with my mobile Pass?

Use the planner to search for journeys you want to take. Tap to save them to "My Trip," where you can see an overview of your travel plans. When you're ready to take a train, tap to add that journey to your Pass, and it will appear on your ticket in "My Pass," ready for inspection on board.

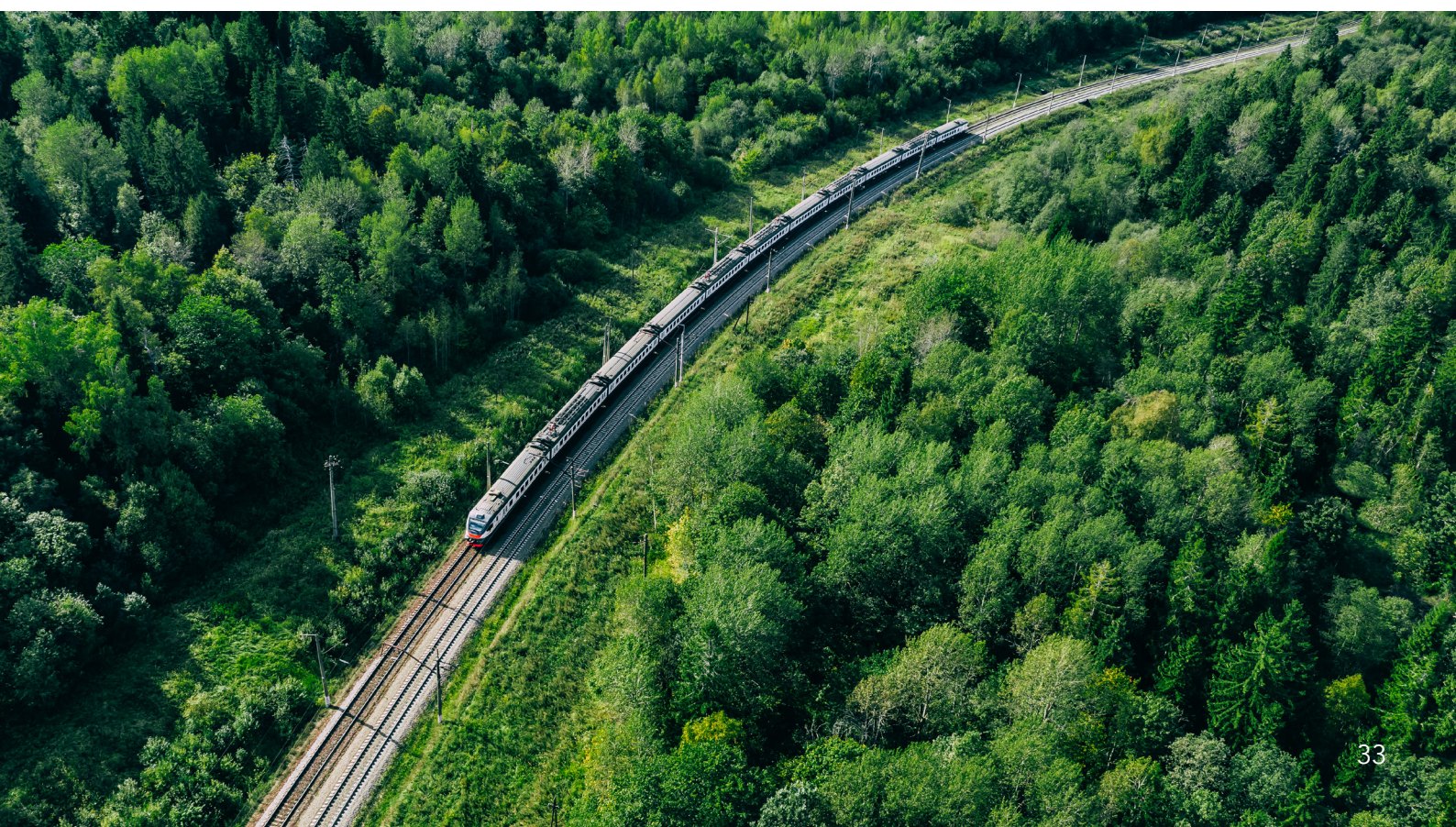
### How do I make a seat reservation with a Rail Pass?
